- Contribute to the determination of local public health priorities and standards for public health program initiatives.
- Provide medical consultation for operational and public policy issues.
- Teach learners and health practitioners about public and population health principles and practices.
- Support the strategic planning process and operations of the work unit, including community engagement and human and financial resources strategies.
- Contribute to fostering an environment of employee engagement, cultural humility, and continuous quality improvement.
- Assesses the health of the public through understanding the health of populations, the factors that underlie good health and those that create health risks.
